## The True Origins of Thanksgiving

Most of us have grown up with the stories of the origins of Thanksgiving. According to American tradition, the first dinner was held at the Plymouth Massachusetts settlement by the pilgrims. This is a true story, of course, and harvest festival was held in 1621 with the Wampanong native American people, who were a primary source of foods for the winter of 1620 for the struggling colony. However, that feast was a three day celebration of their survival and not looked on as a thanksgiving feast at the time, but a celebration of survival. The colony would not have a thanksgiving observance until 1623, but that was more of a religious observance than a feast.

The origins of Thanksgiving was already well established in some parts of Europe, including England, as a harvest festival tradition of thanking God for a years harvest by lighting bonfires, dancing and eating to be fit for the upcoming winter. Actually, the first known such feast in America was celebrated by Francisco Vásquez de Coronado and the native people he called "Tejas" on May 23, 1541 in what is now Texas.

There may be a few of us in the Torske Klub who remember that it was President F. D. Roosevelt who declared in 1939 that Thanksgiving would be the Thursday before the last Thursday in November. His motivations were prophetic, since he believed it would give merchants a longer period to sell goods for Christmas.

## Nostalgia - Chicago Syttende Mai Parade - circa 1964

In 1964, the Norwegian colony in Chicago held the annual Syttende Mai parade along North Avenue in Chicago, as it had for many years.
