



Ambassador J.D. Bindenagle Addresses November Luncheon

J.D. Bindenagle, DePaul University vice president for Community, Government and International Affairs and former US Ambassador, will speak at our November luncheon. Mr. Bindenagle has served in the U.S. Army, the State Department and in U.S. embassies in Germany in various capacities from 1972 to 2003. A former American ambassador and 28-year veteran of the U.S. diplomatic corps, Mr. Bindenagle was appointed by President Bill Clinton in 1999 as U.S. Ambassador and Special Envoy for Holocaust issues and reached agreements on World War II-era forced labor, insurance, art, property restitution, and Holocaust education, research and remembrance. From 2002-2003, Mr. Bindenagle was special U.S. negotiator for "Conflict Diamonds," leading a U.S. government negotiation, which resulted in a worldwide ban on sales of illicit, rough "conflict" diamonds from financing insurrections against legitimate governments in Africa.

Date Change for November!

The date of the November luncheon has been changed to **November 3** from the usual second of Saturday November 10.

He was U.S. Chargé d'Affaires and deputy chief of mission in the U.S. Embassy, Bonn, Germany, from 1994 to 1997 and director for Central European Affairs in the Bureau of European and Canadian Affairs at the State Department from 1992 to 1994. He was U.S. deputy chief of mission at the U.S. Embassy in Berlin, East Germany, at the time of the fall of the Berlin Wall in 1989 and helped negotiate the reunification of Germany. Other Foreign Service assignments included head of the embassy political affairs unit in Bonn in the mid-1980s, when he helped pave the way for the deployment of U.S. Pershing missiles on German soil. He also was an American Political Science Association fellow with Congressman Lee H. Hamilton

Bush in 2002. He serves on boards of the Humanitarian Aid Foundation, the International Visitors Center Chicago, the German-American Chamber of Commerce of the Midwest and the Arthur F. Burns Fellowships. He serves on numerous other boards and organizations.
